

Proclamation of Easter on Epiphany

Deacon 1

Dear brothers and sisters, the glory of the Lord has shone upon us, and shall ever be manifest among us, until the day of his return. Through the rhythms of times and seasons let us celebrate the mysteries of salvation.

Deacon 2

Let us recall the year's culmination, the Easter Triduum of the Lord: his last supper, his crucifixion, his burial, and his rising celebrated between the evening of the sixth day of April and the evening of the eighth day of April, Easter Day being on the ninth day of April.

Deacon 1

Each Easter — as on each Sunday — the Holy Church makes present the great and saving deed by which Christ has for ever conquered sin and death. From Easter are reckoned all the days we keep holy.

Deacon 2

Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent, will occur on the twenty-second day of February.

Deacon 1

The Ascension of the Lord will be commemorated on the eighteenth day of May.

Deacon 2

Pentecost, joyful conclusion of the season of Easter, will be celebrated on the twenty-eighth day of May.

Deacon 1

And, this year the First Sunday of Advent will be on the third day of December.

Deacon 2

Likewise the pilgrim Church proclaims the Passover of Christ in the feasts of the holy Mother of God, in the feasts of the Apostles and Saints, and in the commemoration of the faithful departed.

To Jesus Christ, who was, who is, and who is to come, Lord of time and history, be endless praise, for ever and ever. Amen. [Amen. Amen.]

Have You Considered Chapter Nominations?

The Chapter is the governing board of the Cathedral Church of St. Paul. Many of its duties are prescribed by canon law, such as the responsibility for cathedral finances and care of church property. However, in a real sense, the Chapter serves as representatives of the members of the cathedral, provides leadership and vision as the cathedral moves forward in prayer and commitment to mission, and serves as the communication body between cathedral members and the clergy/staff of the Cathedral. The term limit is 3 years, and members are expected to attend the monthly meetings and to assist with possible Cloister assignments.

At the Annual Meeting in January, cathedral members will be asked to elect four new members to the Chapter.
