The Holy Gospel

[John 1: 29 – 42]

Deacon The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John.
People **Glory to you, Lord Christ.**

John saw Jesus coming toward him and declared, "Here is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world! This is he of whom I said, 'After me comes a man who ranks ahead of me because he was before me.' I myself did not know him; but I came baptizing with water for this reason, that he might be revealed to Israel." And John testified, "I saw the Spirit descending from heaven like a dove, and it remained on him. I myself did not know him, but the one who sent me to baptize with water said to me, 'He on whom you see the Spirit descend and remain is the one who baptizes with the Holy Spirit.' And I myself have seen and have testified that this is the Son of God." The next day John again was standing with two of his disciples, and as he watched Jesus walk by, he exclaimed, "Look, here is the Lamb of God!" The two disciples heard him say this, and they followed Jesus. When Jesus turned and saw them following, he said to them, "What are you looking for?" They said to him, "Rabbi" (which translated means Teacher), "where are you staying?" He said to them, "Come and see." They came and saw where he was staying, and they remained with him that day. It was about four o'clock in the afternoon. One of the two who heard John speak and followed him was Andrew, Simon Peter's brother. He first found his brother Simon and said

to him, "We have found the Messiah" (which is translated Anointed). He brought Simon to Jesus, who looked at him and said, "You are Simon son of John. You are to be called Ce'phas" (which is translated Peter).

THE HOMILY

THE NICENE CREED, *standing*

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: by the power of the Holy Spirit he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried.

On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son. With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified. He has spoken through the Prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

The Prayers of the People

The sections in italics are taken from Dr. King's, I Have a Dream speech. All stand or kneel for prayer. The Leader and People pray responsively

Deacon: Let us, God's people, pray.

Intercessor: As we come before you, we are painfully aware that we are a nation still sadly crippled by the chains of discrimination, and still failing to live up to the promise that all people are guaranteed the "unalienable Rights" of "Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness." God of mercy,

People: Keep reminding us of the fierce urgency of Now.

Intercessor: Remind us that this is no time to engage in the luxury of cooling off or to take the tranquilizing drug of gradualism. Now is the time to make real the promises of democracy. Now is the time to rise from the dark and desolate valley to the sunlit path of racial justice. Now is the time to lift our nation from the quicksands of racial injustice to the solid rock of brotherhood. God of justice,

People: Keep reminding us that now is the time to make justice a reality for all of God's children.

Intercessor: The whirlwinds of revolt will continue to shake the foundations of our nation until the bright day of justice emerges. Until that day, help us not be guilty of wrongful deeds. Let us not seek to satisfy our thirst for freedom by drinking from the cup of bitterness and hatred. Give us the strength to conduct our struggle on the high plane of dignity and discipline. God of freedom,

People: Help us remember that our destiny and our freedom are bound up in the destiny and freedom of our neighbor and that we cannot walk alone.

Intercessor: We pray for Michael, our Presiding Bishop; Betsey, our Bishop, and for all clergy and people. In our diocese, companion dioceses, and the Anglican Communion we pray for St John by the Campus, Ames; St. Ninian, Dundee in Brechin; Nambia Parish Nzara; Luve Parish, Swaziland; and The Church of England, let us pray to the Lord. We pray for safety and courage for our sisters and brothers of Burns United Methodist Church in Des Moines, and Pastor Rev. Dr. Jacqueline Thompson. As we face the difficulties of today and tomorrow, help us hold fast to the faith, through which we will be able to hew out of the mountain of despair a stone of hope. With this faith, we will be able to transform the jangling discords of our nation into a beautiful symphony of brotherhood. With this faith, we will be able to work together, to pray together, to struggle together, to go to jail together, to stand up for freedom together, knowing that we will be free one day. God of hope,

People: Let freedom ring.

Intercessor: God of mercy, justice, freedom and hope, we pause in this moment to remember the life and work of your servant, Martin, and to offer you our other heartfelt thanksgivings, intercessions, petitions, and memorials, aloud or silently...

The People may add their own petitions

The Celebrant adds:

O God, in these turbulent days when fear and doubt are mounting high, give us broad visions, penetrating eyes, and power of endurance. Help us to work with renewed vigor for a warless world, for a better distribution of wealth, and for a brotherhood that transcends race or color. In the name and spirit of Jesus we pray. Amen.

THE CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION

Deliver us from the presumption of coming to this Table for solace only, and not for strength; for pardon only, and not for renewal. Let the grace of this Holy Communion make us one body, one spirit in Christ, that we may worthily serve the world in his name.

People Risen Lord, be known to us in the breaking of the Bread.

Celebrant Accept these prayers and praises, Father, through Jesus Christ our great High Priest, to whom, with you and the Holy Spirit, your Church gives honor, glory, and worship, from generation to generation. **AMEN.**

Since it began in the spring of 2018, BCI has provided dismantling racism training, educational programming, Underground Railroad pilgrimages, youth retreats, and partnered with BIPOC-led groups for interfaith action and advocacy. Through BCI Meg now works monthly with over 30 other Episcopal leaders in the state through the Reparations Task Force, the Dismantling Racism trainers, and the BCI advisory groups.
