

About Messiaen and His Music

Born in France in 1908, Olivier Messiaen was one of 20th century's most prominent composers for organ. His harmonically and rhythmically complex compositions include a wide variety of orchestral, choral, and organ works most of which reflect his deeply spiritual Roman Catholic faith. Messiaen was organist at Église de la Sainte-Trinité, in Paris, for 61 years until his death in 1992. *L'Ascension* suite consists of four movements, two of which are presented today. The *Prayer from Christ ascending toward His Father* is based on Christ's prayer in St. John's gospel, "And now O Father, I have manifested Thy name unto men. . .and now, I am no more in the world, but these are in the world and I come to Thee." The inspiration for the *Outburst of joy from a soul before the Glory of Christ which is its own glory* is taken from Paul's letters to the Colossians and Ephesians, "Giving thanks unto The Father which hath made us meet to be partakers of the inheritance of the Saints in light. . . has raised us up together and made us sit together in heavenly places in Christ Jesus."
