

- We welcome The Reverend Martin Chevalier, today's guest homilist at both services. A The Reverend Martin Chevalier, a Des Moines native with long and deep roots in this community, was ordained a priest at Saint Ambrose's Cathedral, Des Moines, by then Roman Catholic Bishop Maurice J. Dingman on Saturday, November 26, 1983. Father Chevalier served as a parish priest in the Des Moines Catholic Diocese for the first twenty years of his priestly ministry. In 2003, and for the next twenty years, he transitioned to clinical and hospice chaplaincy. He retired from active ministry in the Des Moines Catholic Diocese on June 30, 2015, and later retired completely from active chaplaincy/priestly ministry from the Catholic Archdiocese for Military Services on September 29, 2023 where he served as the Catholic/Hospice & Palliative Care chaplain at the Des Moines VA Medical Center. Father Martin has sung with the Saint Paul's Episcopal Cathedral Choir since 2015.
